PROGRESS REPORT

We have had fantastic progress these past months in Tapestry 218. Currently all 34 panels from the first half of the Tapestry are either finished or being worked on. The first three panels are already joined together, with three more soon to follow. Since each panel is stitched by a number of stitchers, this means we have many people hard at work. We have gained new stitchers along the way...... a presentation in Seattle to PNNAG (Pacific Northwest Needle Arts Guild) resulted in 4 new participants, with 5 more interested. stitchers travel to Vancouver once a month to put in a full day's work at Tapestry 218. We provide lunch and are exploring the option of overnight housing, either through donated hotel accommodations or private guestrooms. We are so grateful that stitchers who live as far away as Seattle and Salem are eager to make the trip here to work on this piece of art - it reminds us of how unique and wonderful this project is.

PANEL SPONSORS

Earlier this year a suggestion was made to us concerning fund-raising. In our last newsletter we announced a new program - Panel Sponsorship. I'm so happy to announce that we have had very positive results! William Hidden recently pledged to sponsor panel #31, Mother Joseph's Academy, for \$1,000. This panel is one of the largest and shows The Academy Building which is constructed of Hidden bricks. The good news is that this was the seventh sponsorship. The Introduction strip #0 with the Chinook and Tapestry logos is being sponsored by Suzan McCarty for \$100.; Jan and Steve Oliva are sponsoring panels #11 (\$700.)and #12 (\$300.) depicting the dedication of Fort Vancouver and Dr John McLoughlin, in honor of the original location of Fort Vancouver which is now their neighborhood. Harriet Wilson's greatgrandfather, Dr William Henry Watkins, was stationed here as the fort physician in 1862- as a gift to her mother she has sponsored panel #21, Soldiers Arrive, for \$250. Lorain and Spud Bowers have opted for the St James Parish panel, # 33 for \$300. Lorain is also one of our most active volunteers in the project; she has already stitched on 7 different panels. Another volunteer, Linda Downing, a Seattle stitcher, is both working on and sponsoring the Statehood panel #34 (\$300.), in honor of her great, great-grandfather, John Patrick Sharp, who was a state legislator from Yakima. Thank-you so very much to all our sponsors and we hope you'll soon be joined by many more!


#### CLIMATE OF EXCELLENCE
