Through one of the innumerable grapevines around town, we learned that the Washington School for the Deaf would soon have spare classroom space. We fired off a letter to Len Aron, Superintendent of the school, stating our needsto make a long story short, we are now the very proud occupants of Room 218 on the second floor of the main building. This former art room comes equipped with loads of built-in shelving, cabinet space, running water, big tables and chairs. Best of all is an entire wall of north-facing windows - the greatest source of light any artist could ask for. There is parking space available for volunteers; the room is accessible directly from the parking lot and up one flight of stairs. Rest-room facilities and handicap access are available. Starting November 7, Tapestry 218 will be open Tuesday - Thursday , 9:30 - 3:30 with other times by special arrangement.


Let us know if you would be willing and able to welcome guests or provide some home-made goodies for the crowd at the Open House.
